7. Sources of information	The survey responses and the list of email addresses for persons who would like to receive an Ärräkoodi-coupon will be collected with two separate survey forms. Tutkimustie Oy will send the list of email addresses to TATTE ry via email with password protection.
8. Regular disclosure of data and recipients	Regular disclosure of data to third parties: The survey will be concucted by Tutkimustie Oy, a company offering research services, as commissioned by TATTE. Tutkimustie is responsible for the collection of data, its analysis and for reporting the results of the survey as agreed with TATTE ry. The Ärräkoodi- coupons will be ordered from R-kioski, which is a part of Reitan Convenience company. If the number of codes ordered exceeds 500, they will be delivered by Arena Interactive. 13. Rights of data subjects	Data subjects have the following rights under the EU's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR):
	- Right of access
	 Data subjects are entitled to find out what information the University holds about them or to receive
	confirmation that their personal data is not processed by the University.
	- <u>Right to rectification</u>
	 Data subjects have the right to have any incorrect, inaccurate or incomplete personal details held by the University revised or supplemented without undue delay. In addition, data subjects are entitled to have any unnecessary personal data deleted.
	- Right to erasure
	 In exceptional circumstances, data subjects have the right to have their personal data erased from the Data Controller's records ('right to be forgotten').
	- Right to restrict processing
	 In certain circumstances, data subjects have the right
	to request the University to restrict processing their personal data until the accuracy of their data (or the basis for processing their data) has been appropriately reviewed and potentially revised or supplemented.
	- Right to object
	 In certain circumstances, data subjects may at any time object to the processing of their personal data for compelling personal reasons.
	- Right to data portability
	 Data subjects have the right to obtain a copy of the personal data that they have submitted to the University in a commonly used, machine-readable format and transfer
	the data to another Data Controller.
	 Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority Data subjects have the right to lodge a complaint with a
	 Data subjects have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority in their permanent place of
	residence or place of work, if they consider the
	processing of their personal data to violate the
